



THE LOCKDOWN RESOLUTION


UK Premiere by Mammalian Diving Reflex

In the spring we invited three young Bristolians to create a remarkable show with us.

The Lockdown Resolution was created through those long, isolating months, with artists from Bristol, Melbourne, Brighton and Toronto. Together we experimented with VR for the first time, bringing together remote audiences from across the world, with live audiences in Arnolfini's theatre, to share glimpses into each others' lives.

Live radio broadcast by Mamoru Iriguchi

With Mamoru Iriguchi at the helm, we experimented with live radio broadcast in collaboration with 12 artists from nine countries. People gathered by candlelight in their homes, in the final hour of their day.

A live broadcast from Bristol mixed the sounds coming up from our own streets with those from artists broadcasting from streets, and oceans, fields and volcanoes across the world.
